Artist Paper – Written Assignment

Directions:

Describe, analyze, and interpret a work of art. While attending an exhibition of contemporary art in Denver (or its surrounding areas), select **ONE work of art** from the exhibition, and write a *formal analysis* and a *descriptive review*. It does not have to be a drawing but you should consider formal design elements –shape, line, repetition, variety, value, unity, rhythm, composition, etc. It can be a piece that you either like or do not like. Take notes while at the gallery.

Your paper must be <u>at least 2 pages</u> in length, typed, 12 point font, 1" margins, and double spaced. ASK BEFORE TAKING PHOTOS AT GALLERIES.

Use the Four Elements of Art Criticism listed below as guidelines to help you write about the piece.

1. Description

- a. "What do I see?" What does the work look like?
- b. Subject matter objects, imagery, shapes.
- c. What is the size and shape of the work?
- d. What is the title of the piece, name of artist, medium, date?

2. Analysis

- a. "How is the work organized?" The composition and construction of the piece.
- b. Visual subjective, objective, highly representational, abstract.
- c. Describe the work in terms of shape, line, repetition, variety, value, unity, rhythm, composition, etc.
 - i. Discuss such topics as the use light/shadow, use of shape, etc. as they apply to the individual piece.
- d. Discuss the work in terms of composition (use of Directional Force, Harmony, Balance, Variety, Emphasis, Movement, Economy) How does the eye move around the piece?

3. Interpretation

- a. <u>In your view</u> What is the work about? What is happening? What is it trying to communicate/say?
 - i. Quickly list many adjectives that describe the character of the work. Is it calm or chaotic? Loud or quiet?
- b. Feeling, mood, or ideas communicated by the work
- c. Expressive qualities use of techniques/materials
- d. How does the scale and dimensions relate to the overall feel of the work?
- e. How do the materials used relate to the overall feel of the work?
- f. How do the formal elements relate to the overall feel of the work?

i. Shape

iii. Color

ii. Texture

iv. Value

4. Aesthetic Judgments

- a. What do you think of the work? Why?
- b. What drew you to the piece? Why did you select it?

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Suggested writing format:

First paragraph: Introduction Second paragraph: Description Third paragraph: Analysis

Fourth paragraph: Interpretation Fifth paragraph: Aesthetic Judgments

Sixth paragraph: Conclusion
