

Compositional Styles

Composition = the arrangement of shapes and forms within a picture plane, chosen by the artist to direct the viewer's eye.


Composition – Open – extroverted, loud, making a statement, implies that the drawing continues off the edges of the page






Composition – Closed – quiet, intimate, introverted, precious, drawing contained well within

margins of the page






Composition – Balanced – equivalent visual weight throughout the page






Composition – Asymmetrical / Weighted – visually weighted in one section of the page, draws emphasis to a particular portion of the drawing







Composition – Vertical – eyes are directed up and down or across the picture plane, reinforces


two-dimensionality/flatness






Composition – Horizontal - eyes are directed up and down or across the picture plane, reinforces two-dimensionality/flatness







Composition – Angular - diagonal line and shape arrangement, dynamic / faster movement of the eyes in and out of the picture plane, suggestive of depth






Composition – Sequential - shapes and forms are presented in a sequence across the picture plane, can feel "orderly"






Composition – Quadrant - division of the picture plane into equal parts





Composition – Pyramid - pyramid arrangement of shape and forms, stable, keeps the eye within the picture plane





Composition – Split- picture plane is visually split by shapes/forms
